

# Chanda's forest academy among top 10 civil insts

Nagpur: The Chandrapur Forest Academy of Administration, Development and Management, which plays a crucial role in training and developing forest officers to serve in various capacities in the forestry sector, has been accredited as 'outstanding' under the Capacity Building Commission's (CBC) national standards.

"With this evaluation, the academy is among the top 10 civil service institutions in the country, and with three stars shares same rank as the Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, Dehradun, which trains the IFS officers across the country," said APCCF and director of the academy MS Reddy.

The academy offers comprehensive training programmes for officers of the Indian Forest Service (IFS) as well as range forest officers (RFOs) and other department personnel.

The assessment was done by National Accreditation Board of Education and Training (NABET). The process was part of the National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building (NPCSCB) under 'Mission Karmayogi', an initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to create a professional, well-trained, and future-ready civil service that is citizen-centric and focused on building a 'New India'.

The CBC works to improve the skills and knowledge of government officials. The NABET is an autonomous body that accredits national civil service training institutes in India as per the National Standards for Civil Service Training Institutions.

Reddy said, “The accreditation process is rigorous, and it involves a review of the academy’s curriculum, faculty, facilities, and resources. A team from the CBC visited the academy recently and evaluated it based on at least 58 criteria.”

The NABET lauded the academy, located near Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve, for its programmes that focus on a wide range of subjects, including forest management, wildlife conservation, biodiversity, environmental laws, community engagement, and administration. “The accreditation is valid from December 2023 to 2025. The recognition will help attract more trainees and make it easier for the academy to partner with other organizations,” said Reddy.

Bombay HC denies pre-arrest bail to 1992 batch civil services officer in duping caseThe Bombay High Court denied pre-arrest bail to IAS officer Ashutosh Kumar and co-accused Sanjay Pandey, who are accused of cheating investors and collecting over Rs 5 crore. The court stated that custodial interrogation of the applicants is necessary for a fair investigation. Kumar is currently a regional director and Pandey is a director of the LFS group of companies. The court also mentioned the multiple crimes registered against Kumar and the need to establish a money trail.
