Delhi: Fire department starts sprinkling water at 13 pollution hotspotsThe Delhi Fire Services has started a water-sprinkling operation at 13 pollution hotspots in the city to tackle the worsening air pollution crisis. These hotspots were identified based on the levels of PM10 and PM2.5 pollutants. The operation aims to settle down dust and improve air quality. The city's Air Quality Index (AQI) has been recorded as 'severe', prompting the implementation of emergency measures, including restrictions on polluting vehicles and construction activities. The odd-even car rationing scheme will also be implemented, and in-person classes in schools suspended to protect the health of students.105014767

Pollution lens on major cities before, during & after DiwaliThe Pollution Control Board of Assam (PCBA) will monitor air and sound quality in the state during Diwali to measure pollution caused by firecrackers. Air quality in major cities will be monitored for 7 days before, 2 days during, and 7 days after Diwali. Other districts will only be assessed during Diwali. The presence of pollutants and heavy metals will be checked. Sound pollution will also be assessed in designated silent, residential, and commercial zones. PCBA appeals to people not to burst crackers as it affects air quality and poses health hazards.105055282
