MIYAWAKI TECHNIQUE

Miyawaki is a method developed by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki to develop dense forests in constrained areas

The technique ensures that plant growth is 10 times faster

The resulting _ plantation is 30 times denser than usual

30% Percentage of absorption of carbon dioxide over conventional forests

3,000% Increase in noise & dust isolation

1 metre Guaranteed annual growth in each tree

Green cover is free of chemical fertilizers
