The <u>first cohort for this program (https://agrilifetoday.tamu.edu/2023/09/11/first-class-of-deans-excellence-scholars-announced/)</u> has been selected and just began their first academic year at Texas A&M. Jeffrey W. Savell, Ph.D., vice chancellor and dean of Agriculture and Life Sciences, said the new tree will serve as a lasting symbol of the program.

"I love the saying that one generation plants the trees, and the next generation enjoys the shade," Savell said. "We are planting a tree in gratitude for what we've been given, to commemorate this scholarship campaign and to remind us all to help future generations."

Students within the Dean's Excellence Scholarship program are some of the best and brightest future leaders. Selected as incoming freshmen, they will receive \$4,000 per year for four years to assist in funding their undergraduate education. The student scholars will also have access to special events hosted by the College. Exclusive opportunities will allow the students to engage and network with leadership across Texas A&M AgriLife (https://agrilife.tamu.edu/), the agriculture and life sciences industries, and more.

"Getting this scholarship means that the College is investing in my education," said Johanna Jacob, a Dean's Excellence Scholar and genetics major. "It makes me want to do more and be better than I even originally planned."

Every year, the college will welcome a new round of scholars. The <u>campaign</u> (https://agrilifetoday.tamu.edu/2023/01/13/largest-scholarship-campaign-in-history-of-college-of-agriculture-and-life-sciences-announced/) was established by Savell earlier this year with the Texas A&M Foundation. The goal of the campaign is to create 120 \$100,000 endowments. The endowments create the scholarships in perpetuity, ensuring a lasting impact. Every scholar now and in the future can enjoy the shade from this tree for many years to come.

The program is designed to support all areas of study within the College. Additionally, the first year of this program held an additional focus on recruiting <u>Corps of Cadets (https://corps.tamu.edu/)</u> members and first-generation students.
