Union forest minister inspects Project Cheetah at Kuno

Bhopal: Union forest minister Bhupendra Yadav visited Kuno National Park in Sheopur district of Madhya Pradesh on Tuesday to assess the progress of PM Modi's ambitious Cheetah Project.

Twenty cheetahs were translocated from Namibia and South Africa, three of whom have died.
