Chakrata Forest Division has created a city forest in the year 2017 by planting a variety of species in the reserve forest area near Kalsi. The Forest Department team has developed 350 species in the city forest of Kalsi spread over an area of about 25 acres. Which includes Amla, Harad, Kachnar, Lemon, Reetha, Elephant fruit, Pomegranate, Bacli, Peepli, Dhrit Kumari, Timur, Peach, Peepal, Many species exist, including banyan. Apart from this, 14 species of bamboo have been developed here. Which is regularly maintained by the Chakrata Forest Division team. Akhilesh Rawat, a member of the Board of Governors of the Indian Forest Management Institute (IIFM) Society of the Union Ministry of Forest and Environment and Climate Change, reached Kalsi on Monday, inspected the city forest and spoke about the importance of various species of plants grown here. DFO Chakrata Deepchand Took information from Arya. DFO Deepchand Arya said that mixed species plants have been planted in the city forest according to the geographical environment of Kalsi and its adjacent area.
