The SDGs with a direct connection are Goal 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), Goal 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy), Goal 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), Goal 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production), Goal 13 (Climate Action), Goal 14 (Life Below Water), and Goal 15, (Life on Land). The Paris agreement is a legally binding international treaty on climate change adopted by 196 parties at COP 21 on 12th December 2015. The 2021, United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP 26) was held at Glasgow from 31 Oct to 13 November 2021, which concluded with the adoption of reducing the use of fossil fuels.

The Environmental Symposium, entitled, "Our Relation with Nature" in collaboration with Government and in association with NLCO aims to become the leading annual symposium at NIT Srinagar on 10th of December 2021.
